Information was previously received from a SITH COX, who had a boy friend named HOMARD COMEN stationed in Metz. France, with the United States Army. According to this information, one of COMEN's friends "translated or decoded the G.I. paper's headlines to read, 'Kennedy will be assaudinated Tranksgiving Day,' and later changed it to read the very day he died."

On March 4, 1984, Lieutenant Colonel W. L. ADAMS, Jr., Assickant Chief of Staff, G-2, furnished the following additional information:

Captain HOWARD C. COWEN, assigned to the United States Army Depot at Metr, France, advised on February 18, 1964, that during the evening of Movember 22, 1963, he conversed with an anguaintance named DERMIS DE WIFF. During the conversation, D. WIFF said that a friend of his, EMBERE DINKIM, had predicted President KERMEDY's assassination for November 22, 1968. According to DE WIFF, DINKIM had first predicted that the assassination would take place on Movember 28, 1963, but later reportedly changed the date to November 21, 1963.

According to Colomel ADAMS, Captain COMEN reported the above conversation to officials of the 765th Army Intelligence Comps Detachment at Hebr. A short time later, Captain COMEN also related his conversation to a girl friend named BETH COM. Her present address, according to Colomel ADAMS, is LISA BETH COM, 616 West listh Street, New York 27, New York.

Colonel ADAMS stated that EWVENE B. DINKIN was the subject of a closed investigation by the Office of the Assistant Chief of Staff, 0-2, United States Army Communications Zone, Europe. He advised further that according to
