advised he was born December 18, 1937, at Dallas, Texas.

RIKE advised on November 22, 1963, while he was employed by Oneal Incorporated, Funeral Directors, that at 12:19 p.m. on that date he and ambulance attendant DENNIS McGUIRE were dispatched in ambulance No. 606 to pick up an injured person at 100 N. Houston Street, Dallas, Texas. RIKE said when they got to the scene they picked up a man who was conscious and only slightly injured with a facial laceration. He said this man did not appear in bad shape but, according to his recollection, had suffered an epileptic seizure. RIKE advised he took this man to Parkland Hospital and within moments after arriving President KENNEDY was brought to Parkland Hospital. RIKE stated there was much confusion at the hospital and during this confusion the patient he had just brought to the hospital walked off. RIKE stated he does not recall this man's name but it should be in the records at Oneal Incorporated, Funeral Directors.

RIKE stated he was advised by a Secret Service Agent at Parkland Hospital that his ambulance was not to be moved because they might need it to move the President to another location. RIKE stated he cleared the hospital at 3:00 p.m. and returned to Oneal Incorporated, Funeral Directors.
