Re: Dr. Humes' refusal to discuss the autopsy findings:

- (1) The New York Times of December 6, 1963, reported that "The best authority presumably on the exact angle of entry of the bullet is the man who conducted the autopsy. He is Dr. J. J. Humes at the Naval Medical Center, Bethesda, Md. Dr. Humes said he had been forbidden to talk." Source: Joachim Joesten, revised edition, page 180.
