The following items were received by SA VINCENT E. DRAIN from Lieutenant CARL DAY, Dallas Police Department, Crime Laboratory, for comparison by the FBI Laboratory. These items, according to Lieutenant CARL DAY, were evidence pertaining to the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY, Dallas, Texas, November 22, 1963.

These items were formerly delivered by me to the FBI Laboratory, Washington, D. C., on November 27, 1963:

(1) One palm print found on a box by the window of the sixth floor, 411 Elm Street, Dallas, Texas. This box believed to have been used by assassin for sitting purposes.

(2) One spent hull of 6.5 mm shell believed to have been fired from rifle, SN C2766, believed to have been the gun used in the assassination.

The following items were released by Lieutenant CARL DAY to the FBI. These items have already been examined by the FBI Laboratory on November 24, 1963. These items were carried to the FBI Laboratory by SA VINCENT E. DRAIN personally on November 27, 1963:

(1) One live round rifle shell, 6.5 mm, which was found in rifle, SN C2766, which is believed to be the gun used in captioned assassination.

(2) Two spent hulls of 6.5 mm shells, believed to have been fired in rifle, SN C2766, believed to have been the gun used in captioned assassination.

(3) One blanket found at the scene where rifle was located which may be blanket used as cover for carrying this rifle.

(4) One shirt taken from suspect LEE HARVEY OSWALD at the time of his apprehension, November 22, 1963.

(5) Brown paper which was found at what was believed to be the point of firing of the fatal bullets used in the assassination. This paper possibly may have been used to carry rifle, SN C2766

to the scene of the building from which it was fired.

(6) Fragment of spent bullet found in the body of Governor JOHN B. CONNALLY.

(7) One Smith and Wesson snubnose revolver, SN V510210, which was taken from suspect OSWALD at the time of his arrest by the Dallas Police Department.

(8) One bullet recovered from the body of deceased officer J. D. TIPPIT.

(9) One 6.5 mm bolt-action rifle, inscribed "1941, Made in Italy", SN C2766. Also inscribed on rifle is a crown, which appears similar to an English crown and under this is "R-E". Also inscribed is "Rocca" which is enclosed in rectangular lines and that is on the plunger on the bolt-action on the rear of the gun. On the scope of the gun, is a gunsight, inscribed "Ordnance Optics, Inc., Hollywood, California, OIO Japan." Also inscribed is a cloverleaf and inside the cloverleaf is "OSG".

(10) Four cardboard boxes, which boxes were found at the site where the fatal shots in captioned matter were believed to have been fired by the assassin.
