Synopsis:

JOHN K. JACOBS, United States Information Agency employee, advised his wife, KATIA, exchanged letters with MARINA OSWALD after assassination. MARINA OSWALD dinner guest on 2/7/64 at JACOBS' home; remarked to Mrs. JACOBS that it was her feeling that subject guilty of assassination; that she had written to her family in Russia after assassination but had received no answer. Dr. HERMINIO PORTELL-VILA received message from unknown source in Cuba which indicated to him that file of relations of OSWALD with Cuban Embassy in Moscow in the files of Ministry of Foreign Relations, Havana, was handed to the CASTRO brothers on 11/24/63. He had no additional information in this respect and indicated two articles published by him concerning aspects of the assassination were his interpretative analysis of public source material.
