D-255    Book entitled "English" for study by Russian-speaking persons. Book cover has picture of English alphabet.

D-256    Book entitled "English in Pictures", which is English primer for Russian-speaking persons.

D-257    Book entitled "English" for Russian students of English language for advanced study. Cover has photograph of a girl and a boy student sitting at a desk.

D-258    Russian-Polish dictionary with blue cover.

D-259    Three documents, further described as follows:

Registration card of JUNE OSWALD at Richmond Freeman Memorial Clinic.

Appointment slip for JUNE OSWALD for November 21, 1963 to see Dr. CHAPMAN, Richmond Freeman Memorial Clinic.

Result of examinations:

Specimens D-254 through D-262 were examined and nothing of cryptographic significance was noted.
