In my view, the single most important reason why minimal progress has been made by critics of the Warren Report is the failure of critics to find a formula of cooperation. Apparently, this weakness will continue to dog us to some degree. However, I am hopeful that through the new Committee, we can get most of the critics to work together despite their differing approaches and views of each other.

In frankness to equal your own, I am disappointed but not at all surprised at your decision.

On my next trip to New York, I would hope that you might be willing to have lunch or dinner with me, not to discuss the work of the Committee, but simply because I am such a great admirer in this field.
