Dear Dr. Forman,

I am sure that you must be puzzled by the long silence about the fate of your article. It occurs to me that I should let you know the circumstances which are causing the delay.

Just at the time I forwarded your manuscript to Mr. Arnoni, TMO was suddenly confronted by a very grave financial emergency, so serious as to jeopardize continued publication. Mr. Arnoni was compelled to put everything aside while he attempted to raise funds so that the magazine can survive.

He left some weeks ago for California, seeking by personal visits to obtain support, and from there proceeded to Europe for the same purpose. I don't know just when he will return or whether he has been successful in his mission, so I cannot give you even an approximate date when you might hear from him about your ms. I do know that he was caught up in such a whirlwind that he was not able to read the article before he left.

I am very sorry that things turned out this way and very anxious, above all, that TMO should continue, since it has a unique and invaluable role to play--especially in the very disquieting state of the country that we are all witnessing. I feel sure that you will understand and be willing to give it more time.
