Garrison's Bird Dogs On New Trail

Trade Mart, was charged early this year by Garrison with conspiring to assassinate Kennedy.

Shaw pleaded innocent. He is to go on trial in February.

"Like Clay Shaw, Mr. Bradley's name did not come up in the federal 'investigation' of the assassination nor is his name mentioned anywhere in the 26 volumes of the Warren report 'inquiry' into the case," Garrison's office said in a statement.

The district attorney refused any further elaboration.

Bradley, reached by telephone at his home in North Hollywood, Calif., by The Associated Press, denied any knowledge of the assassination or of Garrison's investigation.

"This man is either being highly paid to do this or he's off his rocker," Bradley said of Garrison.

The 49-year-old Bradley said he has worked out of his home for five years as West Coast representative of Dr. Carl McIntire, a New Jersey evangelist radio broadcaster.

"I have never been in New Orleans in my life except when my wife, daughter and I recently visited our son in school last March or April," Bradley said. "We just drove through."

NEW ORLEANS — Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison's office yesterday filed charges of conspiring to assassinate President John F. Kennedy against a freckle-faced man identified as Edgar Eugene Bradley.

He was the second man Garrison has charged with plotting to kill Kennedy.

The office said Garrison personally was pursuing the suspect outside the state and an arrest was "imminent, within the next few days."

The district attorney's office would not say where Bradley was from or his connection with the assassination, which Garrison has been investigating for a year.

Garrison's office released a photograph showing a freckled man in his late 30s or early 40s. In a statement, he was identified as Bradley.
