Sylvia Meagher has asked me to send you copies of our October, November and December 1967 issues; they were sent some two days ago and I trust they have reached you. She also asked me to send you certain information concerning responses to our editorial on Garrison.

As a rough estimate, I would say that we received about 120 responses to that editorial. This is a rather heavy response as far as our editorials are concerned. It is, however, way below the almost 700 letters we received from redders concerning our special issue on the Arab-Israeli conflict.

Of the ca. 120 responses to the Garrison editorial. I would estimate only between a fifth and a sixth to have been favorable. The majority of the dissenting comments was characterized by unusual vehemence. Most of the people responding to that editorial had written us before commenting on matters related to the Kennedy assassination.

I hope that the above will prove of value to you.
