Belin: "What do you mean the colored boy that worked in that depository?"

Sawyer: "He is one that had a previous record in the narcotics, and he was single supposed to have been a witness to the man being on that floor. He was supposed to have been a witness to Oswald being there." Belin: "Would Charles Givens have been that boy?" Sawyer: Yes, I think that is the name..."

Belin: How do you know he was supposed to be a witness on that?

Sawyer: Somebody told me that. Somebody came to me with the information. And again, that particular party, whoever it was, I don't know. I remember that a deputy sheriff came up to me who had been over taking these affidavits...with a picture and a description of this colored boy and he said that...he was the one employee who was missing, or he was missing from the building. He wasn't accounted for, and that he was suppose to have some information about the man that did the shooting.

6H 324 Sawyer: Later that afternoon one of our colored officer detectives saw this colored man in the crowd across the street...and he took him into custody and sent him immediately down to Captain Fritz' office.
