5H 35-36: Revill testifies that at about 2:30-3 p.m. knew only that someone named Lee had been arrested. "And this was told to me by a colored employee of the School Book Depository. Myself and Lt Frank Dyson took charge of the search of the building and we must have had 75 or 80 men...assisting in this search. I talked to a Negro by the name of Givens, and we had handled this person in the past for marijuana violations and I recognized him and in talking to him I asked him if he had been on the sixth floor, and as well as I recall ...he said, yes, that he had observed Mr. Lee, over by this window...So I turned this Givens individual over to one of our Negro detectives and told him to take him to Captain Fritz for interrogation...while going to the police station I passed this detective and Givens and they came into the homicide and robbery bureau shortly after Hosty and I did, so I am sure Captain Fritz did talk to Mr. Givens.
