Oswald's whereabouts

Records contradict testimony

Lee Harvey Oswald was in Dallas at work in the Texas School Book Depository the day ex-spy Harita Lorenz supposedly was riding in a car with Oswald and four other members of an "assassination squad" from Miami to Dallas, according to the depository's time records.

Oswald also telephoned his wife after work on either the same day, Nov. 19, 1963, or the day before, said Mrs. Ruth Paine, in whose Irving home Marina

Oswald was living at the time.

Miss Lorenz alleges Sturgis was one of the persons in the car. The book depository's records show Oswald worked eight hours Nov. 19, a Tuesday, and eight hours the preceding day. Found among Oswald's personal possessions after he was arrested Nov. 22, 1963, was a cash receipt for \$2.35, dated Nov. 19, at Eagle grocery store, 1201 N. Bishop St. in Dallas. Mrs. Paine first testified before the Warren Commission that Os-

wald called Marina Nov. 19, then later testified it was the Nov. 18.

On one of those two days, Miss Paine said, Oswald called angrily complaining that Mrs. Paine had tried to reach him at his Dallas boarding house one day earlier using his real name. She had asked for him over the telephone at a time he was renting a room under the alias "O.H. Lee," she said.

Mrs. Paine testified that Marina said Oswald told her "he was living under a different name. He was angry that we had tried to call him and she said that this is not the first time she had felt between two fires, and I judge that she meant between a loyalty to him and a feeling that what he was doing was not right"

Miss Lorenz has told New York authorities Sturgis came to New York earlier this week to try to make her change her story about the auto trip with Oswald from Miami to Dallas. She said all occupants of the car were members of a CIA-approved assassination squad known as Operation 40.

Miss Lorenz reportedly was Cuban Premier Fidel Castro's lover in the 1950s and later allegedly was in-

olved in a plot to poison him.

Miss Lorenz allegedly has told investigators from the House Assassinations Committee Sturgis shot at President Kennedy from the grassy knoll in Dallas.
