A research group urging a new investigation of President Kennedy's assassination said yesterday that it was seeking

yesterday that it was seeking the identity of two of three men photographed in police custody in Dallas just after the fatal shooting Nov. 22, 1963.

The Kennedy Assassination Inquiry Committee, whose national chairman is Trent Gough, a Canadian actor, said the picture of one long-nosed, thin-lipped man resembled a Mexico City police sketch of a suspect in the murder of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

Richard Sprague, a management consultant and photograph researcher, said that the three men might have been removed from freight cars in a railroad yard just ahead of the assassination site in Dealey Waza in Dallas within 45 minutes to an hour after the shooting.
