This bulletin is a preliminary to a series of newsletters we expect to be sending you until the time that the work of the Committee is done. We hope that this will be soon.

We need your assistance! There is a tremendous amount of group work connected with our petition campaign, and we have other activities planned for the next few months, including an in-depth public opinion survey of the assassination. People are needed for organizing work as well as typing, mailing, etc. Whatever help you can give will be greatly appreciated.

For example: a new play "The Trial of Lee Harvey Oswald," will open on Broadway at the ANTA Theater on November 9th with previews commencing October 27th. We need your help to petition the audience outside the theater. We expect this to be an excellent situation for collecting signatures, and we need volunteers for as many evenings as you can spare.

For those who live and work outside New York City, we need your help organizing in your city. Petitioning, interviewing, etc., must be carried on cross-country. Please write us and ask us to put you in touch with others in your area.

We are also urgently in need of funds. At the bottom of this letter is a form we ask you to fill out and return. For a donation of five dollars (\$5.00) we will make you a member of the Committee, for which you will receive a quite frequent newsletter keeping you up-to-date on our activities and with developments surrounding the assassination. Larger donations, will, of course, be greatly appreciated as we have plans for an extensive advertising campaign.

The card enclosed is designed to give us the information we require to call on you for assistance. As an example, we ask the "nature of occupation" as we are in need of a lawyer, in need of office space and equipment (are you in real estate?), etc. Remember, with or without experience, on many levels, we need your help! Please fill out both these forms and send us whatever you can, today.
