"... a group of responsible American businessmen and civic leaders have agreed to establish a committee to enlist the cooperation of informed and interested Americans to enable those Cuban friends of our Republic to carry on an intensive campaign of education in our behalf, and in the interest of a free Cuba. This committee will be launched by Americanism Educational League, to be known as "AMERICANS FOR CUBAN FREEDOM." The actual campaign within Cuba and elsewhere, through underground channels, and in Latin America countries, will be in the hands of highly qualified Cubans, many of whom have had long experience in this field."
