Dear Mr. Treleaven,

Thank you for your letter of 15 September 1965, which I read with pleasure.

The subject index is typewritten on white letter-size paper (8-1/2 x 11") and consists of 91 loose sheets in a manila folder. In addition to the master copy, I have one thermofax duplicate from which I am detaching about 15 pages, selected at random rather than in consecutive order. Those pages are enclosed herewith, as samples for your inspection, in confidence and with a view to prospective mutual arrangements.

You will see that there is some variation in the density of material according to page, so that the total of 91 pages gives a close approximation but not an exact indication of the size of the index.

In addition to the subject index, I have compiled a supplement to the name index which appears at the end of Volume XV of the Hearings. The Volume XV index provides references in Volumes I-XV only. My supplement adds references to relevant Exhibits (Volumes XVI-XXVI) for about 230 names. The supplementary name index, perhaps in expanded form, might be combined with the subject index in a single presentation. I enclose a copy, also in confidence.

I shall look forward to hearing from you again after you have had an opportunity to examine the enclosed facsimiles.
