On December 7, 1963, HARRY MC CORMICK of the "Dallas Morning News" advised the Dallas Office of the FBI that in February, 1963, a friend of his, GWYNNE GASSAWAY, 3708 Armstrong, had written a letter to the editor which letter had been published in his paper. As a result of this letter being published, Mrs. GASSAWAY received an anonymous communication signed "A Worker".

MC CORMICK said on November 24, 1963, the "Dallas Morning News" carried a facsimile of LEE HARVEY OSWALD's letter to JOHN CONNALLY, "Secretary of the Navy". MC CORMICK said Mrs. GASSAWAY saw this facsimile letter of OSWALD's in the paper and has told him she believes the handwriting in the facsimile and the handwriting in the anonymous communication she received, are the same. MC CORMICK was advised by Mrs. GASSAWAY that the original anonymous letter which she received had been turned over to the FBI by her in February, 1963.

The anonymous communication, dated February 16, 1963, signed "A Worker", postmarked February 16, 1963, Dallas, Texas, which was previously turned over to the Dallas Office by Mrs. GASSAWAY, was located in Dallas files and forwarded to the FBI Laboratory on December 9, 1963 for comparison with the known handwriting of LEE HARVEY OSWALD, for the purpose of determining whether the anonymous communication was or was not written by OSWALD.
