There were only three calls about your portion of the program after you left since some of the lines were apparently out. Even one of these was unintelligible on tape. The man who makes reference to Haslam's is actually one of my favorite callers even when he is carrying on as he does here. He has defended me just as vigorously as he took the opposition. Most of the listeners are familiar with his overstatements and take them as protesting too much on the part of an individual who does not question the Warren Report. The man who read the record jacket is one, if I recognize the voice, who is one of the leaders of a Nazi-oriented youth group. The Wallace lady is known to the listeners as: The Bible-totin' hatchet lady, the lady militant, the lady general, etc. You will notice that the call by a man is interrupted with a gap. Ordinarily I can depend on a commercial to turn the tape over. Bob Ruark loused me up this time and I had to cut out part of "Spinoza's" statement-question. He surprised me by asking about the manner by which Oswald got his job since that has been covered ever so many times on the program in the past. Oh, yes; the Haslam's referred to is the major bookstore here and I can't think of a better "university" than a bookstore. If you have any questions about any of the program, ask and I will try to get answers.
