Dear Mrs. Hartmann,

I must ask you to forgive still another hastily-written note but upon reading your letter of the 20th it occurred to me that I should have sent you a copy of a letter I sent to Clay Shaw, enclosed, to which I have not received any reply.

Also, I am uneasy at your expectation that I will be identified as working for the World Health Organization when I do the broadcast. Because of staff rules, I have been very careful not to mention WHO on the dust-jacket of my book, etc. It may cause me serious difficulties if I am advertised as a WHO official for a discussion of ACCESSORIES, which is unrelated to my job. Would it be possible for you to speak to Mr. Ruark about this and see if he would not agree to omit mention of my work for WHO and just limit himself to my work on the Warren Report. If absolutely necessary, he could make some vague reference to the fact that I work in the field of international health, as the back flap of the book jacket indicates.
