Thank you for the copy of the review of your book. As you thought, both Mr. Sorensen and I appreciated it. The most impressive thing, to me, is that this is so long after the publication of the book that it might cause a second printing. And wouldn't that be wonderful?

Mr. Sorensen had sent me a copy of the December 1967 TMO with the other review, "Veto by Assassination", so I made a copy of that and the one you sent and sent them both to Bob Ruark so he could read them until the copy of your book arrived.

Last night Bob said he had tentatively planned to have you on the 17<sup>th</sup> but had decided to wait about a month in view of the events of the past hours. He had received your book and he sounded quite pleased as he gave the listeners a short description of the book. He expressed his appreciation for having been provided with the book and I told him I would pass it on to you. Mine too.

There is little comment I can make on what has happened now as my mind is filled, for the most part, with 'cuss words' and they would not make for good reading in a letter. One of the most outstanding observations has been the willingness, almost the determination, of the news media to reaffirm the conclusions of the Warren Commission. Over and over, one after the other, the commentators on radio and TV used the words, "another Lee Harvey Oswald". It was almost as if this latest tragedy had been created for no other purpose than to bury Oswald even deeper.
