SUBJECT: LEE HARVEY OSWALD ASS. SINATION OF PERSIDENT KENNEDY

Assistant Director C. D. DeLoach advised Liaison Agent withett on the morning of 12/3/02, that pursuant to the Director's instructions, Liaison should invediately check with Mr. James J. Howley, Chief, U. S. Secret Service, and inquire about a proposed interview with the subject's widow. The interview allegedly was to take place with Mrs. Oswald on Friday, 12/6/63, by the team of Huntley and Brinkley. Liaison was requested to determine the facts concerning this and to advise Mr. Rowley that the Bureau considered such an interview unwise at this time.

Mr. Rowley was immediately contacted and he advised that he so not heard about the Huntley-Drinkley interview with Mrs. Oswald; hist he too is definitely opposed to any interviews with Mrs. Oswald this time; that Mrs. Oswald remains in the Secret Service Protective astedy and that the Secret Service Office at Dallas is under the corructions that no interviews are to be had with Krs. Oswald withint opproval from his office. Mr. Howley further advised that he has contioned the matter of interviews by the press with Mrs. Cswald to Presidential Assistants Jenkins and Moyer who will bring this to the Fresident's attention. Mr. Howley said he does not have the President to the order of "no press interviews." Mr. Rowley thanked in. Bartlett for bringing this matter to his attention.
