SAC Dinsmore, St. Louis, telephonically advised his office had been advised that the U. S. Marine Corps record for Lee Harvey Oswald had been sent today AMSD to DGK, Washington. SAC Dinsmore was not aware of the exact meaning of these initials but the record was to go to the attention of the Chief Warrant Officer Johnson, Division of Information, Marine Corps Headquarters.

Dinsmore advised a representative of the St. Louis Office had had a chance to look at the file briefly and the file showed Oswald was born in New Orleans, Louisiana; had been released from active duty as a Marine in September, 1959, as a hardship case. He was transferred to the Marine Corps reserves on 9-13-60. Oswald was given an undesirable discharge in view of his application for Russian citizenship. At that time he furnished his residence as Fort Worth, Texas. While in the Marine Corps he was given two summary court-martials while stationed in Japan as follows: 1. Violation of a lawful order to report a weapon. No disposition, 2. Assault of a Staff and non-commissioned officer by throwing a drink on him. No further information available. His mother's name was shown as Margaret; no further information available.
