Re Miami airtel 11-27-63 captioned as above and MM airtel 11-26-63 captioned "Constitutional American Parties of the United States, Racial Matters," both of which enclosed LHM's characterizing [redacted] as a source who has furnished reliable information in the past.

In view of over-all consideration of information furnished by [redacted] to date, much of which is characteristically of a type which cannot be verified or corroborated, and some of which borders on the sensational or fantastic, it appears characterization of his reliability as set forth by Miami is not justified.

It is noted that Secret Service, Miami, has already interviewed [redacted] concerning information furnished in early November, 1963, and of course, therefore, may have their own evaluation of [redacted]. This is a matter of interest to Secret Service and copies of the LHM will be disseminated to this agency. It does not appear we are in a position to describe all of the information furnished by [redacted] in the past as being reliable, and accordingly, the characterization of his reliability should be consistent with this fact.

Miami should amend the reliability statement to show that some of the information furnished by [redacted] is such that it could not be verified or corroborated. Amended pages should be furnished.

Atlanta and Knoxville, pursuant to Bucalls 11-27-63, should expedite submission of results of investigation concerning activities of [Milteer] and [Brown] during the pertinent period.

NOTE: [redacted] originally furnished information 11-10-63 to the effect that [redacted] thought it would be possible to assassinate President Kennedy using a high-powered rifle from a building in Washington, D. C. This information was disseminated to Secret Service. After the President's assassination, [Milteer] in touch with [Milteer] at Jacksonville, Florida, 11-23-63, at which time [Milteer] was jubilant over the assassination. On this occasion, Parties of the U. S. was next move would be against the "big Jew" [Milteer] according to informant and that [Milteer] was in Quitman, Georgia, not further identified. Investigation by Atlanta has indicated there is no truth in the statements by [redacted] and that [Milteer] and [Brown] (originally named by [redacted] as possible accomplice with [Milteer] being further checked. Secret Service has been advised re latter information from [redacted]
