In memorandum Evans to Belmont, December 17, 1963, informaLion was set forth that ienrypetersen, Deputy Chief of the Organized Crime and Rackotcerint Section of the Department, had been approached Dy unnamed superiors in the Department to wort on the Presidential Commas sion inquiring into the assassination of President Kennedy.

Petersen confidentially advised Scion Chief T. J. Medadrews on the afternoon of December 18, 1963, that he had obtained additional information concerning this proposed assignment and had decided that, unless ordered to work for the Commission, he intended to techno the offer. Petersen stated that he had beamed that lowarditillens of the Criminal Division of the Department was to be designated as the Department's representative to the Commission and that he, Petersen, would merely be in the role of assisting Wiltons. Petersen medicated that he did not care to work with Willens and consequently, would not voluntarily accept this assignment.

ACTION:
In accordance with the Director's instructions, Petersen was advised that in the event he does take the position with the Commission, that James R. Mallory is the Bureau's liaison with the Commission and he
