

# Warren Group Probing Beyond Slaying

The presidential commission's investigation of President Kennedy's assassination is going behind a summary of the evidence to dig into the raw files amassed by Federal agents.

Chief Justice Warren, commission chairman, told newsmen after a two-and-a-half-hour closed session late yesterday that the commission has decided "It is essential to our work to have the materials on which the reports are based."

So far, the commission has received reports from the FBI and the State Department.

## Treasury Report

A Treasury Department report prepared primarily by the Secret Service also is being completed with the back-up evidence requested by the commission and may go to the commission this week.

The report is expected to review all the advance planning made by the Secret Service for the President's trip to Texas, the specific precautions taken and the exact role of each agent during the fatal minutes in Dallas.

The report is the product of the Secret Service's own self-examination, which began on the day of the assassination and has been going on ever since.

The State Department report was delivered to the commission

at noon yesterday, and Chief Justice Warren said none of the members had a chance to read it.

## In Skelton Form

Of the five-part report from the FBI received earlier, the commission chairman said it was a summary report in "skelton form."

"In order to evaluate it," he said, "we have to see the materials on which the report was based."

He said he was referring to documents and statements from individuals. Interviews conducted by FBI agents come under the heading of "raw files" and are rarely viewed outside the Justice Department.

It was indicated, however, that the FBI will turn over to the commission anything it requests.

## Indefinite Wait Due

The public is in for an indefinite wait to learn the details behind the apparent conclusion that Lee Harvey Oswald, accused assassin of President Kennedy, and Jack Ruby, charged with the slaying of Oswald two days after the assassination, each acted alone and were not a part of a conspiracy.
