With reference to Rosen to Belmont memorandum 11-25-63 disclosing that ASAC Joseph Sylvester, New Orleans Office, advised that the District Attorney's Office arrested Patrick Martens and Roland Beaubouf.

Bufiles disclose the following information with respect to the above two individuals and to an individual by the name of David William Ferrie, at whose home they were arrested.

Bufile 105-104340 discloses Ferrie, born 3-28-18, Cleveland, Ohio, has been very active in the Cuban Revolutionary Front, New Orleans, Louisiana, has possessed firearms and other equipment in his Metairie, Louisiana, home and that he was interviewed by Bureau Agents on 8-22-61. Interview and background information developed strongly suggests that Ferrie, a former Eastern Airlines pilot, is a "crackpot," a description used by acquaintances to describe Ferrie. A preliminary Bureau investigation under a possible Neutrality Act character failed to indicate the existence of any neutrality matter violation by Ferrie.

Bufile 87-52503 reveals Ferrie was interviewed 9-29-60, claims he was swindled out of \$2,500 in connection with a mining operation in British Honduras.
