Dear Sylvia,

Thanks for your letter of the 3rd. I will keep your comments on the Alba matter in mind as I continue checking it out, and will keep you informed of the results. A few points for now:

CE 2957 indicates that Klein's did check for other orders from Oswald/Hidell, and found none. I don't know of any check on the kind of ammo and clip they were selling, but I haven't looked yet. The 6/63 AR ad did include clip and ammo, the same as the 2/63 one.

Pending confirmation, it appears that one of the Klein's ads in FBI Item D-85 (CD 578) is from the 6/63 AR. I will check this, and try to locate the one taken from Alba and see if the edges match.

AR is presently available on at least some newsstands here. I don't recall anything on where Oswald got the 2/63 issue. He saved an awful lot of junk but not, I think, things like Time magazine or AR.

Lifton mentioned Liebeler's troubles, but only briefly and I don't recall any details. Was it in the papers?

Enclosed is a story from the latest Free Press. I wasn't aware that Marks is one of the nation's leading authorities on the assassination. In the same issue, Mark Lane calls Mort Sahl "almost the only consistent voice " in the investigation. Gack.
