Dear Paul,

Thanks for your letter of the 14th and its enclosures. I had already seen Russ Stetler's piece on Oswald and the FBI, perhaps in an earlier version, but the Hoch/O'Toole article from the SEP was new to me. It was both interesting and provocative, congratulations.

Perhaps it will reassure you to know that Random House promised my book for Friday and promptly on that day (Friday the 13th) two copies were delivered to me by messenger. Accessories looks very handsome in its new costume, which I think is much more attractive than the original dustjacket, and copies will be in the stores in a few short weeks.

Now I am impatient to see the Scott/Hoch/Stetler anthology and I hope that the publisher will meet the 2/20/76 deadline.

I had heard from someone, I forget whom, that the Archives was declassifying more documents. Needless to say, I would like to see them. My problem is, I do not have the time and I do not have the storage space. Just the same, perhaps I will order copies of the 650 pages you intend to acquire in the first instance. I would be willing to split the costs with you (e.g., each page would cost 15¢ plus 3½¢ for a xerox copy or a total of 18½¢, which you and I could divide equally between us...in dollars, about \$60.00 each. If you get another person, the total cost per page would be 22¢, or \$143 split three ways...do you agree?).
