Dear Sylvia,

Thanks for your letter of 4/5. Of course, if Anson and Jones would like to get copies of the CIA documents from me, I would be glad to have copies made for them.

Enclosed is a letter to Marston, which explains my current concern about the Schweiker Committee. Since you and I were reported to be the critics with the best contacts with Schweiker, I thought you ~~would~~ would be interested. Since I wrote the letter, I have talked with David Lifton, who informs me that you have had even less contact with the Committee than I have.

Also enclosed is the original transcript~~s~~ corresponding to 6H352. The time ~~was~~ has been changed twice from 11:45 to 11:55. Ralston interprets this as making the time incriminatory, since 11:55 is essentially lunchtime, but I'm not sure the change is that significant evidence-wise. Also, on 6H350, the question was originally "Did he ~~not~~ have any boxes in his hand?", not "books." Ralston points out that not having boxes ~~was~~ suggests he was not building the sniper's nest, while not having books just means that he was not doing his job. The ~~changes~~ changes may have been made by ~~some~~ someone other than Belin, but in any case they were at ~~a~~ least a serious violation of procedure. (Corrections to the transcript were supposed to ~~have-been~~ be indicated like so. (-----)) I'll try to get someone to find the Archives copy of the transcript or galleys with the changes indicated, to see if that clears things up at all.
