Dear Sylvia,

Thanks for your letter of 2/26, and the check. You now have \$20.36 in your account.

I do appreciate your desire not to sign up for anything involving the HSC's evidence. Peter has been trying to talk me into a publication-oriented project, which might actually happen; partly because of my experiences with Random House, I can't work up any enthusiasm at all for it. From Jeff, I gather that the HSC's release on the JFK case will be relatively slim, so maybe a big project to divide it up will not be necessary or advisable. The last he heard, they were saying they would publish 3 staff reports on the JFK ~~xxx~~ case: organized crime, anti-Castro Cubans, and Nosenko. That may be changing, however; the target date of 4/1 may have slipped to 5/1. Anyhow, it doesn't look too good.

I have the first 4 volumes of MLK hearings now - public session transcripts, plus everything that Mark Lane made them introduce into the record. Things like ~~x~~ all 200 pages of that laundry log book. Nothing exciting there.

Enclosed is a list of some rather good clippings Bud ~~xxx~~ sent around; if you didn't get them, feel free to order by number.

Also, a fascinating pre-assassination clipping which Peter Scott got from someone who found it in the LEIU files (of the FBI). It's ~~xxx~~ got everyone in it - Revill, Gannaway, Army Intelligence, LEIU, even organized crime - just my cup of tea! It's not evidence, but should have some ~~xxx~~ propaganda value. It's hard to believe these people didn't know about Oswald!

Warren Hinckle is supposed to be doing a hatchet job on Lane for the S.F. ~~xxx~~ Chronicle. If it comes out tomorrow, I'll include it.
