Dear Paul,

I was delighted to find in today's mail your envelope with a copy of my Berkeley memorandum and the other material.

Paul, I think that your exchange of letters with Manchester is quite significant. I would like to make two suggestions for your consideration. One, that you should write to Christopher Dodd on Berkeley's change of position with regard to conspiracy, for Dodd's information and if possible for any ideas he may have on exploring this matter further.

Two, that you find out from the Kennedy Library whether or not the materials deposited by Manchester--and in particular, any transcripts or summaries of his interviews of Berkeley--are now available.

Berkeley, if he was willing even at this late date, to disclose everything he knows about the wounds and the autopsy, could become the vehicle for a very important breakthrough. What do you think?

I am most grateful to you for sharing the Manchester letters with me, and for sending me copies of my letters to Harold on LEXAND. Thanks very much.
