ROY S. TRULY, Superintendent, Texas School Book Depository Building, advised that a jacket believed to be the property of LEE HARVEY OSWALD was brought to him three or four days after November 22, 1963, by one of the company's employees whose name TRULY could not recall. He did recall that this employee told him the jacket had been found on a window ledge in the employees recreation room, which is located in the northeast corner of the building on the first floor. The window where the jacket was found faces north and the jacket was behind a one-foot railing which sets back from the window. Mr. TRULY stated he subsequently turned the jacket over to an FBI Agent.

Photographs of this area were taken.

Mr. TRULY explained that the book, "Rolling Readers," is packed in cartons, ten to a carton. Such a carton was measured by SA ROBERT M. BARRETT and it is 1'2" long, 8" high and 9" wide. Mr. TRULY explained that at about the time of November 22, 1963, there were four to six such cartons on stock and were kept on the sixth floor. He pointed the area out where the cartons were stored at that time and this area is located 17' north from the south wall of the building and 43' west of the east wall. Photographs of this area were taken.

Mr. TRULY stated that in the southeast corner of the sixth floor about November 22, 1963, there had been stored several cartons of books entitled, "Thinking and Doing, The New People and Progress," a workbook for the sixth grade. These cartons were stacked along the east wall of the building and occupied the corner space of the southeast corner. The books extended along the east wall about 13' in a northerly direction and each carton measures 2'7" in length. Each carton is 2' high and the cartons were stacked two cartons to a stack or a height of about 4'. Mr. TRULY stated that when he first looked at this area following the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY, on November 22, 1963, he noticed several of these cartons had been removed from the southeast corner and stacked on top of the remaining cartons, leaving a space in the corner of approximately 2' square.
