Thank you for your letter of April 15th. Frankly, after your letter of March 6, I felt that you were no longer interested in TRUTH LETTER, because of our divergent views about Garrison. I am glad to gather from your latest letter that this impression was erroneous.

On the other hand, however, I must tell you that I have found myself compelled drastically to reduce the number of complimentary subscriptions with which I had started this newsletter last September. While TL now is a going concern, generally paying expenses and even yielding a small profit, I found the complimentary subscriptions too onerous, mainly because of the high postage costs involved.
