

Copy of letter received January 29, 1965 addressed to Mr. Jim Koethe from Wilma Enot, 1481 Kelchner Rd., Bethlehem, Penn. 18018, mailed to Jim at the Dallas Times Herald and forwarded to me.

January 22, 1965

Dear Jim:

I am sorry not to have answered your letter sooner...I had good intentions at first but I thought I'd get the things done you asked me to do first so I could tell you exactly what I did and where I put the originals. I thought it best to keep the copies in one place and then under no conditions would be lost.

Since I heard from you I have made three trips to Ohio and then with the holidays things were so disarranged and I lost the address you gave me and I felt by your letter you preferred me not to write to the Times, so I kept thinking when things finally resumed to normal I would find your address...but alas, I didn't. It is one of those futile ideas where you put it away so good that it won't get lost that even you cannot find it. Please forgive me. I'd love to be able to be where you are...you might have something going there but probably you will be forced to keep it to yourself. My feelings are with you but often feelings have to be overlooked to preserve the majority of feelings.

I'll wait to hear from you...everything is safe.
