Mr. KUPFERMAN submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring)*, That there is hereby established a joint com-
3 mittee on the investigation of the assassination of President
4 Kennedy to be composed of five Members of the Senate (not
5 more than three of whom shall be members of the majority
6 party), to be appointed by the President pro tempore of the
7 Senate, and five Members of the House of Representatives
8 (not more than three of whom shall be members of the
9 majority party), to be appointed by the Speaker of the
10 House. Vacancies in the membership of the committee
11 shall not affect the power of the remaining members to exe-
12 cute the functions of the committee, and shall be filled in the

1 same manner as in the case of the original selection. The
2 committee shall select a chairman and a vice chairman from
3 among its members.

4 SEC. 2. The committee shall make a preliminary in-
5 vestigation of all the accounts, writings, and reports of the
6 facts and circumstances leading up to and following the
7 assassination of President Kennedy in order to determine
8 whether it is necessary to undertake a full and complete
9 investigation of the facts surrounding the assassination of
10 President Kennedy and the subsequent killing of his alleged
11 assassin. Should the committee determine that further in-
12 vestigation is necessary, then the committee shall make a
13 full and complete investigation of the facts relating to the
14 events and circumstances leading up to and following the
15 assassination of President Kennedy, and upon completion of
16 its investigation shall report its findings to the Senate and
17 to the House of Representatives.

18 SEC. 3. (a) The committee, or any duly authorized sub-
19 committee thereof, is authorized to sit and act at such places
20 and times during the sessions, recesses, and adjourned pe-
21 riods of the Eighty-ninth Congress, second session, and sub-
22 sequent sessions, to require by subpoena or otherwise the
23 attendance of such witnesses and the production of such
24 books, papers, and documents, and reports, including but
25 not limited to all evidence collected by the Commission

1 established by Executive Order Numbered 11130 (known
2 as the Warren Commission) to administer such oaths, to take
3 such testimony, to procure such printing and binding, and
4 to make such expenditures as it deems advisable.

5 (b) The committee is empowered to appoint and fix
6 the compensation of such experts, consultants, and clerical
7 and stenographic assistants as it deems necessary.

8 (c) The expenses of the committee shall be paid one-
9 half from the contingent fund of the Senate and one-half
10 from the contingent fund of the House of Representatives,
11 upon vouchers signed by the chairman.
