Dear Congressman Kupferman:

Thank you for your letter of June 28th. Since we were closed on Monday, I didn't receive it until today.

The statement you include is basically fine. I won't dwell on it long, since you may want to change it after having read the galleys. I'd like to suggest only that it be a little briefer. I'd cut at the beginning, since Sylvia's Index has been available, so ~~that~~ it would start as it does now, the Index sentence, then resume, "On the subject of the Warren Report, Sylvia Meagher could replace a computer etc." I changed "take the place of" to "replace" to make it less mechanical.

Regarding the misspellings, omissions, etc., the galleys you have are unproofread. Both Sylvia and a proofreader have gone over a different set and hopefully all the errors have been caught. The Xerox pages which I inserted into your galleys represent the content changes that were made by Sylvia during the proofreading stage. The book really does end on galley page 168A; that is the last page of an appendix, hence the confusion.

Let me thank you again for your kind help. I'm looking forward to hearing what you think of the book.
