Thank you very much indeed for sending "Ramparts" so quickly. It is a fascinating issue and I was glad to see you were mentioned in Welsh's piece.

I forgot to tell you I'd read your piece in "Minority of One" and discovered through it many new aspects I was totally unaware of. What should we think about the Kennedys giving away the photostats to the National Archives? To me, it is a way of burying deeper the real truth and it saddens me to think that, for their own reasons, the Kennedys are covering up whatever is covered.

A great news: my publisher at "France.50r" has finally decided to send me back to Dallas to do a series of stories on everything that's happened down there in the last three years. I should get there around the 15th or 16th - stay till after the 23d. I hope Penn Jones is back from his Eastern tour. My newspaper seems decided to make quite a fuss about the whole thing. It's rather rewarding in a way, for it is the biggest circulation in France and is rather widely read elsewhere. I therefore hope, that, through whatever I'll find and get published, the U.S. press will follow up - and I hope thus to help, in my own way, the tremendous work all of you have been doing almost anonymously.

I'd get in touch with you when I fly through N.Y. I am very glad to go back to Dallas, at last. I've been waiting for this for a long time, and I hope I can dig a little more and expose all these incredible events.
