Thank you for your thoughtful letter. I was glad to hear from you, but very sorry to learn that the Committee has been forced to close up shop. This is a real blow, not only because the files and records have become inaccessible but because presumably there will be no organized direct investigation undertaken. As I seem to have lost my channel of Committee news, through no fault of mine other than making an assumption which proved to be correct, and to my genuine regret, I should appreciate any news that you feel able to send from time to time--about a revitalized Committee, hopefully, or about your own research or activities of others.

I appreciate the information you provided on the Sauvage article of December 1963; I haven't checked it against Sauvage's book but my recollection is that he discussed the Walker shooting in similar terms. If need be, I can ask Sauvage for a photocopy of that article.

Have you kept in touch with Lebenthal or any of our fellow-classmates? There is a good chance that one or more of us will visit Dallas during summer vacation. If you have any suggestions for urgent on-the-spot investigation, do let me know. By the way, please let me know also if there is a telephone number where you can be reached quickly, or an address where a telegram could be sent, in case of urgent need. One of these days I hope that the class, or most of the class, can get together here for an exchange of news and ideas for further collaboration where feasible.
