P.S. All the evidence suggests that Oswald did not leave Dallas from the time he began his job with Jaggars-Chiles-Stovall in October 1962 until he was discharged in early April 1963, going to New Orleans later that month. When I have a chance, I will look over the payroll records to see if there was any interruption; but I am almost certain, from recollection, that he worked continuously. His letter to Robert may have been a social white-lie; on the other hand, the Warren Report mentions merely "a letter," without confronting the contents or the allusion to an out-of-town trip--which is usually in itself ground for misgivings.
