I wouldn't call it a debate either but that is how the tape-recording was labelled. I defer cheerfully to your own description of the Beverly Hills event but reiterate with all due respect that your statement—that the Commission did not take a single bit of evidence into consideration unless it was under oath—is in conflict with the official record.

Your readiness to discuss the evidence produced before the Commission is very gratifying. However, I am baffled by your failure to comment in your letter of October 6, 1965 on any of the questions posed in my first letter. Each of those problems relates exclusively to evidence which came before the Commission, as indicated by the references cited in my letter to the relevant volume, page, and exhibit number.
