If you did not catch the broadcast in Baturday night, let me reassure you that I did not mention your name. Actually, I had not intended to discuss anything except my own findings, even before Jones Harris gave me your message.

About my notes on the conversation with Eisenbergs I think you should put the same questions to him and see if he does not give you the same encoders, before you assume that I have reported his answere unfairly. Meanshile, just so that there will be no subiguity, let me say that my notes reflect just what Eisenberg held, including the remarks about Finck.

Perhaps I as unsympathetic to the Consistion and the logal staff, now that I have studied the results of their work. However, that will not lead no to misquote them on the contrary, I would wish to quote them as accurately as possible; which perhaps would be a worse discorvice. If they were willing to put things in writing, I would certainly prefer it. However, those who are willing to commant by telephone stipulate that their remarks are not for attribution and that even the fact of the phonecall should not be revealed. Hevertheless, I have summarized much conversations as have occurred as accurately as possible; as they did not require embellishment.
