My dear Senator Cooper,

A friend has sent me the attached newspaper clipping from the Long Island Star-Journal of January 13, 1966. I was most interested of the proposal of the four Congressional members who served on the Warren Commission that a detailed financial accounting should be made part of the official records of the Commission. I had purchased copies of the Warren Report from the Government Printing Office, as well as the Hearings and Exhibits, at considerable cost, under the impression that those volumes contained the complete official records. Apparently public revenue financed the printing and free distribution of 8,250 complete sets of the Report and the Hearings and Exhibits allocated by McGeorge Bundy (Long Island Star-Journal of October 22, 1965).

In view of my direct and indirect expenditures with respect to the official records of the Warren Commission, and those of other interested taxpayers, I hope that you and your colleagues, when you reconvene, will wish to make arrangements for purchasers of the 26 volumes of Hearings to receive without further charges the detailed financial accounting which is to be presented.

Perhaps it would be possible also for the reconvened Commission to make known the results of the investigation which was still in progress when the Warren Report was issued? (See page 324, paragraph 3.)
