Although I am reluctant to prolong our correspondence, I must express my surprise that you considered it permissable or necessary to run to Liebeler and relay my views on the subject of your collaboration with former counsel to the Commission. Apparently you suffer from compulsive and indiscriminate babbling, or you have no concern with simple ethics.

I should have thought that considerations of personal dignity would have prevented such carrying of tales. I am no longer interested in your associations or activities but I do hope that you will have the decency not to gossip with the opposition on conversations or correspondence based on the explicit or implicit understanding that it would not be funneled to the perpetrators of the Warren Report.

Perhaps there is little point in addressing myself to someone capable of such behavior in the first place; but I want this to be a matter of record, in the event of future contingencies.
