Gentlemen,

Fletcher Knebel's attack on the book "Inquest" by Edward Jay Epstein seemed to me to be animated by anger and malice rather than disinterest and logic. Personally, I do not find it hard to believe that the FBI made inaccurate reports of interviews with Arnold Rowland. Study of the testimony shows that at least 61 other witnesses told the Commission that the FBI had reported their statements inaccurately or incompletely.

Nor was Rowland the only witness to be impeached by the Warren Commission. He is in company with Roger Craig, Wilma Tice, W. W. Litchfield, Dial Ryder, Gertrude Hunter, Edith Whitworth, Wanda Helmick, Albert Guy Bogard, C. A. Hamblen, and others. Those witnesses had one thing in common--the foolhardiness of having given information or testimony incompatible, in one way or another, with the Commission's doctrine that both Oswald and Ruby were "lone assassins."
