My dear Farrell,

The description of the "list" purportedly compiled by me as given in your letter of 30 March is too sketchy to enable me to identify it. I have compiled and circulated quite a few lists over the last few years. You will have to provide me with a fuller description or a copy before I can tell you whether or not the list in question is my work.

In your first letter, you asked me to indicate my reasons for repudiating the Garrison "investigation" and, on the assumption that the information would be regarded seriously and objectively, I took the trouble to respond to your request. I am surprised that your letter of 30 March makes no mention of the material I sent you. If you challenge the facts I have elucidated or the conclusions I have reached, I should be most interested in your arguments addressed to the explicit items discussed.

In any case, you are fully acquainted with my position with respect to Garrison and with my determination to have no association of any kind whatever with any committee or group which is so misguided or so unprincipled as to endorse or embrace the New Orleans "investigation" under the pretense of seeking the truth about the assassination. It is my impression that your Committee is actively promoting the Garrison "probe" instead of denouncing it, as a genuine search for truth and justice would demand. If this is a correct assumption, I will be unable to give you any cooperation--as I clearly indicated in my letter to Donald Freed--and I request you and your Committee not to imply in publications or any other form of publicity that I am in any way associated with your effort. If the list in question is, in fact, my work, I do not authorize its publication or use by your Committee without my prior and explicit agreement.

I am sorry to inform you that I know of no way in which you can obtain a copy of my out-of-print Subject Index to the Warren Report and the Hearings and Exhibits. Perhaps you can borrow a copy from one of the critics and xerox it. Let me know if you do this, in which case I will send you some errata sheets.

Finally, I wish to thank you for your kind comments on Accessories After the Fact.
