<u>Narration</u>: The night Robert Kennedy was assassinated, five other persons also were hit by bullets. Seven bullets altogether were found. Now there's evidence of more.

Dr. Robert J. Joling: "...We have now an FBI report, and photographs, which show explicitly four additional bullet holes. So there are four bullet holes in a wooden door jamb, and the center divider, and added to that the seven bullets that we know came out of victims. We have eleven bullets. You cannot get eleven bullets out of an eight shot revolver, which Sirhan possessed on the night in question.

<u>Narration</u>: Private investigators have been saying all along that there was evidence of too many bullets to be accounted for by the gun of Sirhan Sirhan, who was convicted of the Kennedy murder. Los Angeles police photos showed holes in the wall. But the holes were never identified as bullet holes until the FBI recently released its files, and in those files were photos that matched the L.A. police photos and captions that explicitly identified the holes as bullet holes.

> Now the private investigators say there definitely were two guns, maybe even three. And Los Angeles District Attorney Van de Kamp says he will ask the FBI to explain this new development to him.
