Hearing for Ray Set Tomorrow

ST. LOUIS (AP)—The name of James Earl Ray will be called three times tomorrow morning in St. Louis Circuit Court where he has been granted a hearing on a motion for a postconviction remedy.

Ray, sought in the assassination April 4 of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., filed the motion before his escape last year from the Missouri penitentiary at Jefferson City. He was serving a term for armed robbery.

Ray's court-appointed attorney will be on hand, as will a representative of the circuit attorney's office, which has asked for a dismissal of Ray's motion.
