Dear Shirley,

I listened to the tape last night at Isabel's and have mailed it back to you this morning. It was very helpful indeed, because it establishes the fact that Dorothy Kilgallen was quoting from your interview with Mrs Clemmons, not from an official WC document. So the WC is absolved from hanky-panky, in this particular instance. I'm very glad to have the matter cleared up. Thanks again for sending the tape.

One thing I've meant to ask you about is the Teresa Norton suicide. The only thing I know about it is what was in the publication issued by the now-defunct Citizen's Committee of Inquiry, in December 1964, saying that she was a former Ruby stripper and had been found shot to death in a Houston motel about August 1964. The article also said that she was the stripper who was arrested for carrying a gun into the Ruby trial, but I think that was actually Karen Carlin ("Little Lynne").

The other day I was re-reading the Gertrude Hunter/Edith Whitworth testimony about the visit to the furniture store. They are certainly persuasive. What do you make of that story?
