Dear Mr. Richter:

Thank you for your letter of the 10th. I would be delighted to talk to your representative (in my home); however, I do not feel that I can enter into a new correspondence at this time, particularly one that would have to cover so much.

As you may know from Mr. Salandria, I believe in the innocence of Lee Oswald. However, I do not believe in a knowledgeable cover-up complicity by the Commission; but this is a complicated subject that has not yet been adequately dealt with.

I am sure CBS will approach this subject in a wholesome way, wanting neither to hurt nor overly defend any particular group. There is, of course, no substitute for a thorough examination of the 26 volumes of Warren Commission Hearings.
